Battle Lines Drawn

• Wars over agenda, free speech, culture are heating up

As AFP goes to press before Thanksgiving, the battle lines for 2023 are heating up. With Christmas right around the corner, 2023 is shaping up to be a mixed bag as Republicans move to take over the House with a slim majority, unpredictable billionaire Elon Musk seizes the reins at Twitter, and pro-Israel groups flood the nation's capital with campaign dollars to ensure dominance over American foreign policy.

As AFP editors closed the books on our penultimate issue for 2022, Republican leaders were celebrating their win in the 118th House of Representatives, taking a majority of seats (219-212) and ensuring that the terrible agenda advanced by President Joe Biden and his fellow Democrats over the past two years will finally come to a halt much to the benefit of the American people.

GOP TAKES BACK HOUSE

Incoming Speaker of the House Rep. Kevin McCarthy (R-Calif.) has already announced that he will be kicking Reps. Adam Schiff (D-Calif.) and Eric Swalwell (D-Calif.) off their committee assignments. The good news for America is that we will no longer have to endure Schiff and


